Honeypot

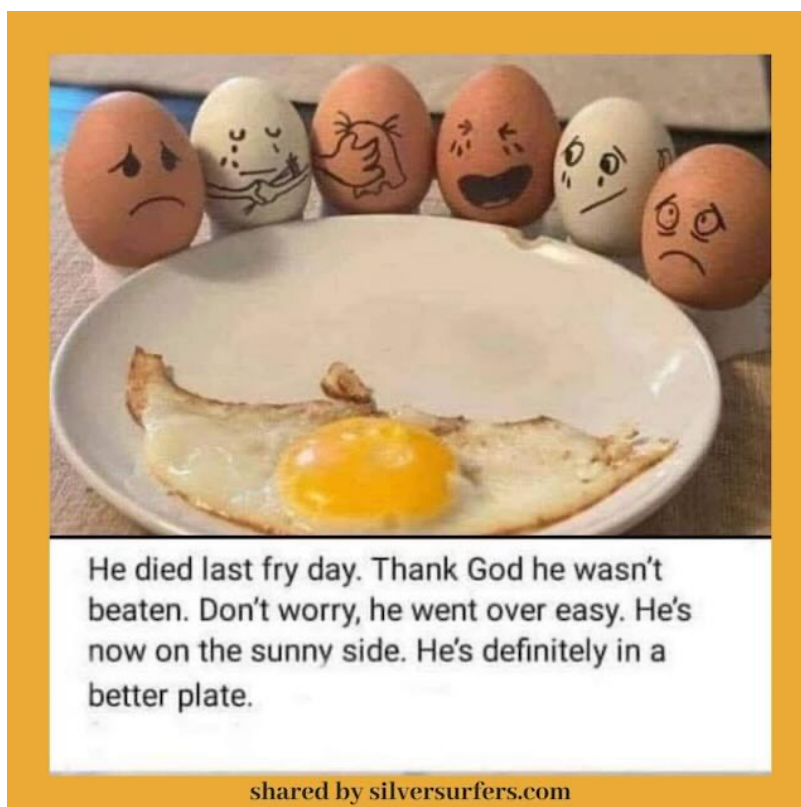
