New Club Handbook

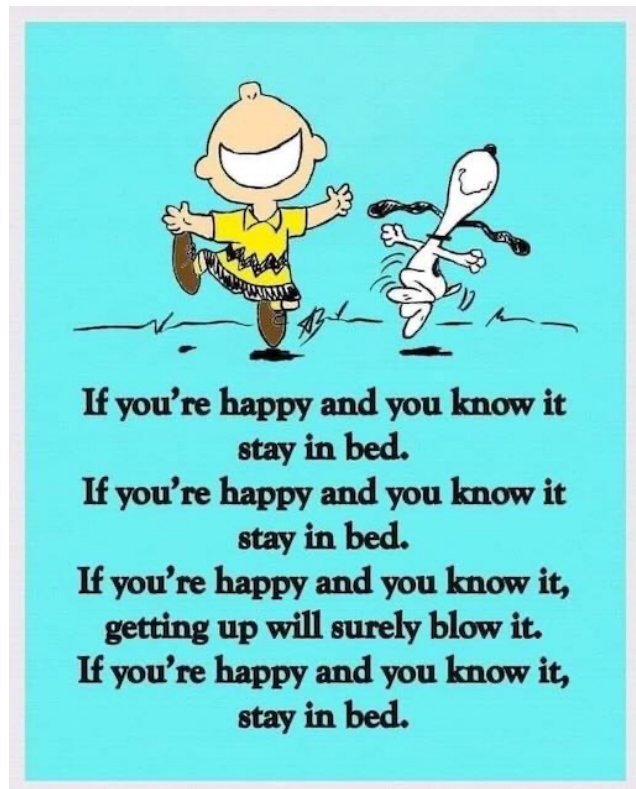
For a voluntary donation to our own Club Charity, the new Club Handbook will be available at the Meeting on 5th July.
