Joint Christmas Dinner with Inner Wheel

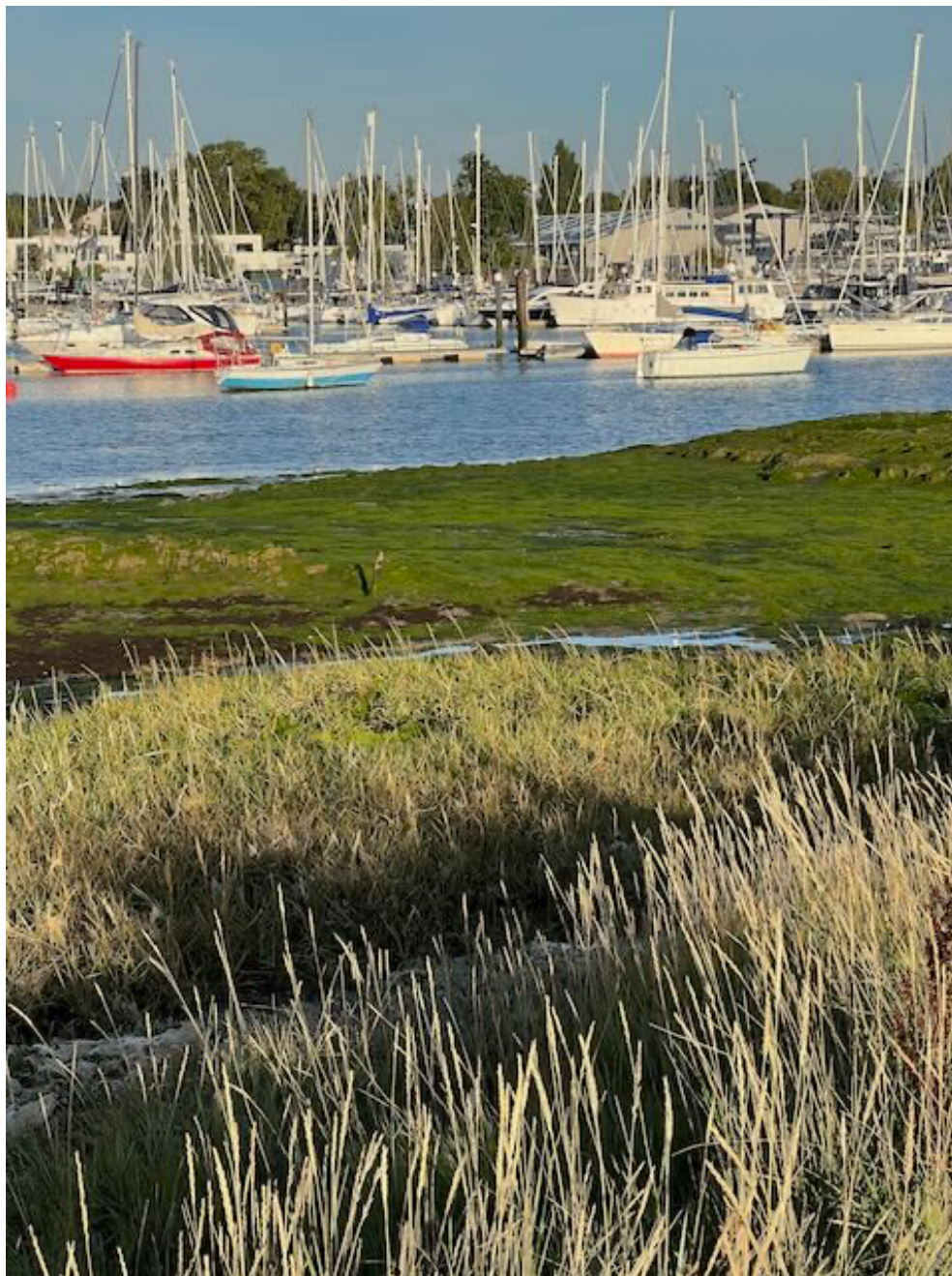
