#### 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Charter Night

We celebrated our 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary since being chartered on 31 October 1972 at a dinner held at the Victory Hall on Friday 4 November, 2022, attended by the Mayor and Mayoress of Fareham, Assistant Governor Ray Drake, Inner Wheel President Eve Aitken, Rotarians, friends and family.

At the dinner Asistant Governor Ray Drake presented President David Creal with a certifcate 'Honouring 50 Years of Membership' of the world wide Rotary movement.

#### Shoeboxes

This year along with the help and assistance of the Inner Wheel Club of Locks Heath we sent 79 Shoeboxes to the District Shoebox Appeal. The District total was 18,224 Shoeboxes.

This year they are going to Montenegro, Moldova and Romania. It was originally planned to also send boxes to Albania but the Albanian customs have imposed a requirement to raise invoices using a special software programme that the NGO says is too expensive for them to purchase. Instead those boxes with the assistance of the Rotary Club of Lublin Centrum in Poland will go to Ukranian refuge children in homes, orphanages and community groups in Poland. The Rotary Club of Lublin Centrum also confirmed that they are willing to work with Rotary International Kyiv to see if it is feasible to get a van load of boxes to Lviv or Kyiv to be given to children in orphanages in those cities.

#### Acts of Kindness

We were asked by the Iner Wheel Club of Locks Heath if we would join them in supporting the charity "Acts of Kindness Community (Solent)" very recently. This is a local charity distributing food parcels across Fareham, Gosport and Porchester and they are now operating as a foodbank for Fareham and Gosport after a temporary take over at the beginning of the Covid crisis from the Fareham and Gosport Basics Bank (Friends of the Homeless).

They appealed for chocolates and other sweets to put into the food parcels for Christmas in order to give those receiving the food parcels a special treat at Christmas. We responded with the items shown below and along with Inner Wheel we did receive a special thank you from them.





#### **Salvation Army**

Chocolates left over from the AOK donation together with the items that were left over from the Shoebox sorting, thanks to Sue Westcott of the Inner Wheel Club, all went to the Salvation Army who confirmed that they raised over £700 with all the items that had been donated and particualry thanked the rotary clubs involved. The Salvation Army say that with the generosity they were able to distribute more food hampers.

#### **Special General Meeting**

The main points from the Special General Meeting were:-

- The Club and Charity accounts for the last Rotary year 2021-22 were approved
- We do have a Treasurer for next year, John Selby.
- However, we DO NOT HAVE a President or Secretary for next year, 2022-23.

## **Future of the Club**

Not having a President or Secretary for the next Rotary year that starts on 1<sup>st</sup> July 2023 means that the Secretary will have to inform District that we are unlikley to be able to carry on as a Club past the end of June 2023.

The President Elect is due to attend the "President Elect Training Session (PETS)" in January or February 2023 but more importantly without a Secretary there will be no way for District or RI to communicate with the Club and there will be no one to manage the affairs of the Club.

The District Secretary has already been informed that we have not got a President for next year but without a Secretary the Club cannot continue and we will have to surrender our Charter. Rotarians would be free to join another Club, if they wished.

In a similar way to keep the Club active and alive no one has come forward to take on the following roles:-

- Speaker Secretary even to arrange only a few speakers in the year.
- Publicity whether it is through the web site, Facebook or whatever media
- We have lost our Membership Lead through a resignation someone should take this role on
