Roger Baker would like everyone to know about Eric Moody:

Many years ago we had a speaker at the Club who was a British Airways pilot. He held us all enthralled for almost an hour.

He had been the Captain of a Boeing 747 en route to Perth with 248 passengers onboard. At 37,000 ft over Java the aircraft was engulfed in St Elmo's fire and gradually each of the four engines cut out. The pilots were able to glide the aircraft whilst trying to restart the engines. When they dropped below 12,000 ft the Captain realized they would not be able to clear the mountains and prepared to ditch in the sea. The passengers were informed and many wrote last notes to loved ones. Finally the engines started to respond and fired up, enabling the aircraft to be flown. Contact was made with

Jakarta for an emergency landing. With very little visibility the landing was successful using instruments only.

It transpired that the aircraft had flown through a volcanic cloud, causing the engines to fail and the front of the aircraft, including the windscreen, to be effectively sand blasted. They were all lucky to be alive.

The pilot in question was Eric Moody who has just died in March aged 84. He was a BA pilot for 32 years and amassed 17,000 flying hours. The aircraft was repaired and returned to service. When it was eventually scrapped the aircraft control yoke was presented to Eric. He also received a number of other awards for his achievement in saving so many lives.

RIP Eric Moody.
